Please scratch my second submittal to you. Had misunderstood fragment of TV news I saw on this Coyote Creek iron flood wall. It is not upper Coyote Creek but reach between Old Oakland Road and #280 that is getting iron channel treatment, in fact in RCD back yard.

This is even more tragic from standpoint of loss of natural creek interface with dense neighborhood and more scary if people and animals are swept into box culvert in heavy flow with no means of getting out.

Larry Johmann worked with these residents 20 years ago and canoed this reach often, and if you can reach him he might have a strong perspective of what is now in progress. But it looks beyond recall. Actually, twenty years ago progressive levee upgrade for this reach was scheduled and funded. Afraid management sidelined it. Believe CEO felt flood control too expensive to be worth it.

Can't begin to say how sad this destruction of urban creek corridor of Coyote Creek makes me with both its loss of natural habitat and what was once an exceptional recreation experience.

Hope you can get some more positive response from Valley Water as to their actions here.
