What's next? Including Spanish-Speaking Leaders



- Due to community demand, we have made the program accessible to primary Spanish speakers, working with a language justice interpreter
- The 2023 training cohort includes 6
 Spanish-speaking leaders.

How the program is funded

Sliding scale tuition of \$0-\$3,000/participant. Actual cost is \$15K/participant including the cost of the alumni program.
