Re: Term Expiration from the Guadalupe-Coyote Resource Conservation District

Dear President Wasserman:

Thank you for providing notice of the upcoming expiration of my and Dr. Rick Lanman's terms on the Board of Directors for the Guadalupe-Coyote Resource Conservation District (District). As District President, I hereby provide formal notice that Director Lanman and I will not be seeking reappointment to new terms following the expiration of our current terms on November 25, 2022. The District has already posted a notice of anticipated vacancy on its website ([see \*Notice of Anticipated Vacancy\*](#)).

While Public Resources Code section 9314(a) allows a Resource Conservation District (RCD) director to remain in office until their successor has qualified in order to avoid a vacancy, Director Lanman and I hope this will not be necessary. We encourage your office, as the nominating authority for the Santa Clara County Board of Supervisors, to initiate and conduct a robust recruitment process as soon as possible to help ensure the District can move forward into 2023 with a full Board that includes two new directors.

Under the Public Resources Code, RCD directors are required to meet certain minimum requirements. The District requests your office add or otherwise clarify these criteria in the County's Maddy Report prior to issuing the recruitment so candidates can independently evaluate whether they are qualified prior to applying:

- Pursuant to Section 9314, the Legislature declared its intent that "the board of supervisors solicit recommendations from within the district, including public, private, and nonprofit entities, and appoint only applicants who are determined by the board of supervisors to have a demonstrated interest in soil and water conservation. In selecting directors pursuant to subdivision (b), the board of supervisors shall endeavor to achieve balanced representation on the board of directors."
- Pursuant to Section 9352(a), directors "shall be registered voters in the state."
- Pursuant to Section 9352(b), directors "shall (1) reside within the district or alternatively have served, pursuant to the district's rules, for two years or more as an associate director providing advisory or other assistance to the board of directors, or (2) be a designated agent of a resident landowner within the district."
